RE: Community Clean Up Fund FY19-FY20 Status

The FY19-20 Community Clean Up Fund (CCUF) summary is shown in the table below. In FY18, the Board voted to limit maximum carry-forward balances for each town to five times the town's yearly allocated amount. Consequently, seven towns received less than their maximum annual allocation and two member communities did not receive any additional funds for FY20. The current balance for each town is shown in the last column.

In FY19, nine towns received \$7,083 in funding for the following projects:

- Five towns used funds for dumpster rentals, disposal fees, and labor costs for Green Up Day.
- Labor and disposal costs for a “Stream Clean Up” event
- Disposal costs for mattresses, tires and other items illegally dumped on roadsides
- Purchase of trash and recycling stations for public places (parking lots, parks)
- Demolition and disposal costs for public building renovations
- Collection and disposal of Christmas trees after the holiday season
